For replacement parts only standard ground freight services are covered. This warranty extends to the original retail purchaser only and is not transferable to any subsequent purchasers. This warranty applies to the products bought and used in North America.

Warranty Period

(from date of the original retail purchase)

- Residential use: 1 year
- Semi-commercial, professional or rental use: 90 days

Exceptions Noted Below; the following items are guaranteed by the original manufacturer and have their own warranty, conditions and limited time:

- Tire Chains: <u>90 days</u>
- Engines: <u>Will vary as per the manufacturer</u> Please refer to the engine manufacturer's warranty statement included with the unit. BERCOMAC is not authorized to handle warranty adjustments on engines.

Items and Conditions NOT Covered:

This warranty does not cover the following:

- Pick-up or delivery charges or in-home services fees.
- Any damage or deterioration of the unit, parts and or finish of these due to normal use, wear and tear, or exposure.
- Cost of regular use or maintenance service or parts, such as gas, oil, lubricants, tune-up parts, and adjustments.
- Any part or accessory which has been altered, modified, misused, neglected, accidentally damaged or not properly installed, maintained, stored or repaired not in accordance with the instructions in the owner's manual.
- Repair due to normal wear and or any wear items such as shear pins, bolts, belts, etc.
- Expedited freight fee services for replacement parts.
- Shear bolts and shear pins are to be considered as a preventive measure not as an assured protection, any damages resulting from the lack of shear bolts breakage are not covered.
- Damages due to product being installed on a vehicle other than stipulated in owner's manual.

NOTE: All warranty work must be performed by an authorized dealer using original (manufacturer) replacement parts.

Owner's Responsibilities:

BERCOMAC's defective equipment or part must be returned to an authorized dealer within the warranty period for repairs. In the event that defective merchandise must be returned to manufacturer for repairs, freight fees are prepaid and a written authorization from BERCOMAC must be obtained by dealer prior to the shipment. This warranty extends only to equipment operated under normal conditions. To validate a warranty claim, it is the user's responsibility to maintain and service the unit as specified in the owner's manual or to have the unit serviced at their dealer at their expense.

General Conditions:

SAFETY PRECAUTIONS



Careful operation is your best insurance against an accident. Read this section carefully before operating the vehicle and accessory. This accessory is capable of amputating hands and feet and throwing objects. Failure to observe the following safety instructions could result in serious injury. All operators, no matter how experienced they may be, should read this and other manuals related to the vehicle and accessory before operating. It is the owner's legal obligation to instruct all operators in safe operation of the accessory to prevent accidents or injuries. These are common practices that may or may not be applicable to the product described in this manual.

GLOSSARY:

In this manual, right and left sides are determined by sitting on the seat of the vehicle facing forward.

In this manual, "accessories" means attachments (snowblower, rotary broom, blade, etc.) that you install on the vehicle (lawn tractors, A.T.V. s etc).

TRAINING:



This symbol, "Safety Alert Symbol", is used throughout this manual and on the accessory's safety labels to warn of the possibility of serious injury. Please take special care in reading and understanding the safety precautions before operating the vehicle and accessory.

- 1. Read this owner's manual carefully. Be thoroughly familiar with the controls and proper use of the vehicle and accessory. Know how to stop the unit and disengage the controls quickly.
- 2. Never allow children to operate the vehicle nor the accessory. Never allow adults to operate the vehicle nor the accessory without proper instructions. Local regulations restrict the age of the operator. Children are often attracted to accessories. Never assume children will stay in place where you have last seen them. Keep children under surveillance of a responsible adult at all times.
- 3. No one should operate the vehicle nor the accessory while intoxicated or while taking medication that impairs the senses or reactions. The operator should, if taking over the counter drugs, seek medical advice on whether he/she can safely operate the equipment.
- 4. Keep the area of operation clear of all people, particularly small children and pets.
- 5. Never start or operate the accessories except from the operator's station on the power unit except if this is impossible.

PREPARATION:

- 1. Thoroughly inspect the area where the accessory is to be used and remove door mats, all foreign objects and the like which could be pick up and projected by accessory.
- 2. For motorized accessories, disengage all clutches and shift into neutral before starting engine.
- 3. Prepare for emergencies. Be prepared if a fire starts. Keep first aid kit and fire extinguisher handy. Keep emergency phone numbers (doctor, ambulance, ect) near a phone

- 4. Do not operate the accessory without wearing adequate clothing and safety equipment. Long hair, loose clothing or jewelry can get caught in moving parts. Wear footwear that will improve footing on slippery surfaces.
- 5. Handle fuel with care, it is highly flammable and vapors are explosive.
 - a) Extinguish all cigarettes, cigars, pipes and other sources of ignition.
 - b) Use approved fuel container.
 - c) Never add fuel to a running engine or hot engine.
 - d) Fill fuel tank outdoors with extreme care. Never fill fuel tank indoors.
 - e) Never fill containers inside a vehicle, or on a truck or a trailer bed with a plastic liner. Always place containers on the ground, away from your vehicle, before filling.
 - f) When practical, remove gas-powered equipment from the truck or trailer and refuel it on the ground. If this is not possible, then refuel such equipment on a trailer with a portable container, rather than directly from a gasoline dispenser nozzle.
 - g) Keep the nozzle in contact with the rim of the fuel tank or container opening at all times, until refueling is complete. Do not use a nozzle lockopen device.
 - h) Never overfill fuel tank. Replace fuel cap securely and wipe up spilled fuel.
 - i) If fuel is spilled on clothing, change clothing immediately.
- 6. Never attempt to make any adjustments while the engine (motor) is running (except when specifically recommended by manufacturer).
- 7. Let the vehicle and accessory adjust to outdoor temperatures before using.
- 8. Never use an accessory without proper guards, plates, or other safety protective devices in place
- 9. Always make sure to wear the appropriate safety equipment required (glasses, muffs, mask...) for each type of product. See operation section.
- 10. Always make sure of having safe traction on the vehicle by using the recommended accessories (chains, A.T.V. tracks, counterweights...). See operation section.
- 11. Always make sure all components are correctly installed. (driveline securely attached and locked at both ends, belts properly installed...)
- 12. If applicable, always handle the winch cable with thick leather gloves.
- 13. Never modify the accessory or any part without the written consent from the manufacturer.





OPERATION:

- 1. Do not put hands or feet near, under or inside rotating parts.
- 2. Exercise extreme caution when operating on or crossing gravel drives, walks or roads. Stay alert for hidden hazards or traffic. Do not carry passengers.
- After striking a foreign object, stop the engine (motor), disconnect the wire from the spark plug(s) and keep wire away to prevent accidental starting. Thoroughly inspect the accessory for any damage and repair damage before restarting and using the accessory.
- If the unit should start to vibrate abnormally, stop the engine (motor) and check immediately for the cause. Vibration is generally a warning of trouble. Don not use equipment until properly repaired.
- 5. Take all possible precautions when leaving the vehicle unattended. Disengage the power take-off, lower the attachment, place the transmission into neutral, set the parking brake, stop the engine and remove the ignition key.
- 6. Do not run the engine indoors, except when starting the engine and for transporting in or out of the building. Do not operate or let motor run in a storage area without ventilation because gas contains carbon monoxide which is odorless, colorless and can cause death.
- 7. Never use the accessories across the face of slopes, go from top to bottom. Exercise extreme caution when using equipment on slopes, on wet ground or near drop-off. Do not attempt to use accessory on a steep slope.
- 8. Never tolerate bystanders in the working zone. Never use an accessory in the direction of bystanders, it might throw gravel or debris that can hurt people or damage property.
- 9. Never operate the accessory at high transport speeds on slippery surfaces. Use care when backing up.
- 10. Do not carry passengers.
- 11. Disengage power to the accessory when it is transported or not in use.
- 12. Never operate the accessory without good visibility or light.
- 13. Keep the accessory away from heat sources or flames.
- 14. If applicable, never handle the winch cable or hook while under tension.
- 15. Never use accessory if it has been dropped or damaged. Repair if necessary before re-using.

MAINTENANCE AND STORAGE

- 1. When cleaning, repairing or inspecting the vehicle and accessory: park on a solid level ground, disengage drives, lower implement, set parking brake, stop the engine, remove ignition key, and wait that all moving parts have stopped. For gasoline engine, disconnect wire from the spark plug(s) and keep wire away to prevent accidental starting.
- 2. Check all the bolts and components at frequent intervals to make sure that they are properly tightened and in safe working condition.
- 3. Never store a motorized accessory with fuel in the fuel tank inside a building where ignition sources are present such as hot water and space heaters, clothes dryers, and the like. Allow the engine to cool before storing in any enclosure.
- Always refer to the owner's manual when you store the accessory and vehicle for a prolonged or an unspecified length of time.
- 5. Maintain or replace safety and instruction labels, as necessary.
- 6 For winter accessories, (if applicable), let the engine run for a few minutes after clearing snow in order to prevent the rotary parts from freezing.
- 7. Inspect the vehicle's and accessory's air filter (if applicable) every day. Clean it or replace it as necessary. Change the oil more often when working in dusty conditions. See the vehicle's and accessory's owner's manual.

TRANSPORT

- 1. Review Transport Safety instructions in vehicle manual before moving or hauling.
- 2. Check with local authorities regarding transport on public roads and off road. Obey all applicable laws and regulations.
- 3. Make sure all lights and reflectors that are required by the local highway and transport authorities (exemple : SMV (Slow Moving Vehicle)) are in place, are clean, and can be seen clearly by all overtaking and oncoming traffic.
- 4. Never have the equipment in operation during transport.
- 5. Always travel at a safe speed.

-Always wear heavy leather gloves when handling rope.

IMPORTANT: TORQUE ALL BOLTS ACCORDING TO TORQUE SPECIFICATION TABLE WHEN STATED: TIGHTEN FIRMLY.

THE WINCH KIT IS TO BE USED ONLY TO LIFT BERCO ACCESSORIES, ANY OTHER USE MAY CAUSE DAMAGE TO THE VEHICLE.

This subframe may be used to install different attachments (see attachments page). Once installed, it may remain permanently on your vehicle.

NOTE: It is not necessary to remove mower deck at this step.

INSTALLING THE REFLECTORS

IMPORTANT: When operating the tractor with the front mounted attachment, install the two red-colored adhesive reflectors on the rear vertical surface of the tractor's fender.

<u>STEP 1</u> SUBFRAME INSTALLATION:

Refer to parts breakdown section for parts identification.

Install the left & right supports (item 2) on each side of the vehicle.		
Item #	Description	Action
1	Support (qty 2)	Install on each side as shown.
2	Hex bolt 3/8', x 1'' (qty 6)	Insert as shown.
3	Flat washer (qty 6)	Insert on the bolts (item 2) as shown.
4	Nylon insert lock nut 3/8" (qty 6)	Do not tighten.

TOOLS REQUIRED:

Wrenches:1/2, 3/4, 5/16, 7/16, 9/16, 10mm Ratchet Sockets: 2/16, 1/2, 9/16, 3/4, 10mm Cutting pliers Pliers Square head screwdriver: #2, #3

Please sort out and identify all the hardware before starting installation. Lists for the hardware bag and for the box are supplied in each.



Install the supports

Install the reinforcement plates (item 2) on each side on the supports.

Install the motor oil drain hose attaching plate to avoid any damage to the engine's oil hose.

Choose a location **A** or **B** to install the engine's oil hose attaching plate, (not shown, with the tractor) make sure the hose does not become damaged on any sharp edge. If location **B** is chosen, install the bolts anyway in the **A** location.

STEP 2: WINCH CONTROL SWITCH INSTALLATION

Install the relay (item 1).		
# Item	Description	Action
1	Relay	Install in an appropriate area.
2	Metal screw Secure relay in place #12 x 3/4" (qty 4)	
*3 Nylon tie wrap 8" See * (qty 4)		
*If necessary use the nylon tie wraps to secure the relay in place. ** Install in a sheltered place away from bad weather.		



Before drilling the hole, check behind the dashboard to make sure there is enough space to install the switch.

Drill a 1/2" hole in the dashboard or in an appropriate place (see reference drawing). Stick the UP/DOWN decal over the hole for the switch.

Insert the switch in the hole and secure in place with the rubber boot.

NOTE: It is important to install the switch vertically. Connect the wires as shown.

When the switch is raised, the winch must lift the accessory. If you prefer the contrary, invert the green and black wires.

IMPORTANT

To prolong the winch cable's life, release the winch control switch as soon as the accessory touches the ground. This will keep the cable from tangling up which causes premature wear.

CONNECTING THE WIRES

NOTE: The posts on the relay are identified by colors.

Install the wires on the terminals of the relay.

- Red wire (+) from winch; on blue terminal.
- Black wire (-) from winch; on yellow terminal.
- Red wire (+) from battery; on red terminal.
- Black wire (-) from battery; on black terminal.

Connect the red wire from the winch (limit switch) with the green wire from the relay.



Connect the wires

IDENTIFY THE IGNITION WIRE:

Place the clip of the Hi / Low tester on the negative post (-) on the battery or a metal surface without any paint.

Turn the ignition key to the position: Accessory.

Insert the tip of the tester in a hole at the back of the starter (switch) make sure to touch the metal part of the wire (on most tractors, it is the A1 terminal on the ignition switch that is used for accessories. Before connection, verify with HI/LOW tester).

If the tester's light turns on, turn the ignition key to the position, Off. The light must turn off.

You have identified the ignition wire, if not repeat the operation on another wire.

INSTALL THE CONTROL WIRE:

Join the ignition wire and the red wire from the winch control (item 1) with the instant connector (item 2).

Connect the black wire of the winch control (item 3) to the black wire on the relay.

Connect the green wire of the winch control (item 3) with the red wire of the winch (limit switch).

FOR YOUR SECURITY: Read and follow the safety precautions for the battery in the vehicle's manual.

CONNECT THE WIRES ON THE BATTERY:

Connect the wires from the relay to the vehicle's battery.

The red wire (+) on the positive post of the battery (item 1).

The black wire (-) on the negative post of the battery (item 2).

Make sure to tighten the nuts on the posts.

TIE ALL THE WIRES:

NOTE: Make sure the wires from the control assembly does not interfere with anything on the tractor nor come into contact with any heating, electrical or removable elements of the tractor.

Tie the wires with four nylon tie wraps included in the kit.

2	Hex bolts 1/4 x 1/2" (qty 2)	Tighten firmly.

VERY IMPORTANT:

Make sure the cable winds up and unrolls as shown in the figure (cable under the spool). Lubricate the winch cable and the drum periodically

with grease. <u>If the winch cable does not wind up from the</u> <u>bottom of spool as shown, the limit switch will not</u> <u>work and may cause damage to the subframe,</u>

winch and accessory.

STEP 3: DRIVE MECHANISM INSTALLATION:

NOTE: You must remove mower deck to install the drive mechanism.

WARNING

TO PREVENT INJURIES:

It is the person who installs the drive mechanism responsibility to make sure that when the clutch is disengaged that all moving parts stop. For more information, do not hesitate to contact the technical support.

Install the drive mechanism (item 1).						
# Item	Description Action					
1	Back of drive mechanism	Hook on the tractor frame, one side at a time, at an angle				
2	Front of drive Install between the supports as shown.					
3	Pin	Insert as shown.				
4	Hair pin Secure the pin.					



WARNING

TO PREVENT INJURIES: Stop the motor.

Apply parking brake. Remove the ignition key. Disconnect the wire from the spark plug(s) and keep away from spark plug(s) to prevent accidental starting.



Install drive mechanism

For tractors with Electric Clutch:

Install the belt on the engine pulley of the vehicle.

Check the tension on the spring.

If necessary, adjust the tension by moving the adjustment rod (item 1) and tighten the set screw (item 2).



No modifications to be made

For tractors with Manual Clutch activated by a cable:

Install the tractor's manual clutch cable . * Remove the spring.						
NOTE: As shown, you have to back up the adjustment rod support to location A before continuing the installation.

TO PREVENT INJURIES: Do this verification when the vehicle's engine is not running.

If applicable, you can remove or add a flat washer (item 1) on the tension pulley (item 2) for a better adjustment.

Engage and disengage the clutch a few times and make sure the belt does not touch the belt guide in any place when the drive mechanism is engaged.

If the pulley on the drive mechanism is not parallel with the tractor's pulley, adjust the height of the support (item 1).

INSTALATION VALIDATION

In a safe area, without anybody or object around

Engage and disengage at least 10 times to make sure the drive disengage when the clutch is disengaged.

If it does not disengage, add a some washers between the left belt guide and the tractor's frame to bring the tractor's pulley belt guide closer until the engaging and disengaging works correctly.

TO PREVENT INJURIES:

It is the person who installs the drive mechanism responsibility to make sure that when the clutch is disengaged that all moving parts stop.

OPERATION & MAINTENANCE







Read the vehicle Owner's Manual carefully. Be thoroughly familiar with the controls & proper use of the attachment. Know how to stop the attachment quickly.

CONTROLS

IMPORTANT:

In order to avoid draining the battery of the vehicle, always start the engine before using the winch.

THE WINCH CONTROL SWITCH

Push up or down the winch control switch to lift or lower the accessory to the ground.

There is a limit switch stopper that limits the lifting.

Always prestretch cable and respool under load before installing the hook on the accessory. A tightly wound cable reduces chances of binding, which can cause damage to the cable.

To prolong the winch cable's life, release the winch control switch as soon as the accessory touches the ground. This will keep the cable from tangling up, causing premature wear of the cable.

WINCH CABLE MAINTENANCE

To reduce the risk of cable failure during the season, we recommend changing the winch cable every year. Lubricate the winch cable and the drum periodically with grease.

Install the new winch cable as shown in figure in the parts breakdown.

MAINTENANCE

- Check mounting bolts at frequent intervals for a) proper tightness to be sure equipment is in safe working condition.
- Apply oil at all pivot points. b)
- To prolong the life span of the winch, make sure the c) snap mount switch works well.

BELT REPLACEMENT

- Check the alignment of the belt that joins the e) drive mechanism to the engine pulley.

VERIFY TIRE PRESSURE:

Tire pressure must be even on both sides of the tractor according to the vehicle's owner's manual.
